What are the goals of the GAD market test?



Objective

- Conduct market research to better understand young patients who suffer with symptoms of GAD
- Utilize Facebook ads to attract research participants and direct them to a dedicated landing page and survey

- Number of Qualified Surveys
- Cost Per Lead (CPL)
- Cost Per Qualified Lead (CPQL)
- Survey Data

Definition of a Qualified Lead

 Target parents in the United States whose children are experiencing symptoms of or are at risk for GAD

Campaign Assets

- 2 ad concepts to attract parents of GAD patients
- 1 unique landing page with embedded survey
- 1 market research survey designed to connect with parents of GAD patients
- 1 thank-you landing page



Process and results



Process

Creative Development

- To attract parents of GAD patients, we produced 2 visual variants following proven 83bar best practices.
- The main concept is to use graphics (instead of stock photos) that convey the messaging and force users to stop and look at the ad since it stands out from other content in their newsfeed.

Set Up Ad Targeting & Launch

 Target parents in the United States via paid Facebook newsfeed ads

Measure Results

 Determine Cost per Lead (CPL) generated and analyze survey responses

- Determined winning messaging concept to attract potential clients
- Captured willingness to share information












Survey Questions – Age range



What is your child's age range?




- Captured responses from all leads
- 78% of all respondents indicated their child is between 7-17 years of age
- Target audience is responsive and reachable

Survey Questions – Gender



What is your child's gender?




- Captured responses from all leads
- Majority of respondents indicated their child is a female

Survey Questions – Diagnosis



Has a doctor diagnosed your child with Generalized Anxiety Disorder (GAD)?




- Captured responses from all leads
- A little over half of respondents indicated their child has a diagnosis of GAD
- Percentage may increase with more explicit creative that calls out a diagnosis

Survey Questions – Medical professional



Which medical professional diagnosed your child with GAD?




- Captured responses from leads who said their child was diagnosed with GAD
- A vast majority of them (68%) indicated their child was diagnosed by a psychiatrist

Survey Questions – GAD symptoms



How long has your child been experiencing symptoms of GAD?




- Captured responses from all leads
- Majority of respondents (78%) indicated their child has been experiencing symptoms of GAD for over a year

Survey Questions – GAD symptoms



What symptoms are they experiencing?




- Captured responses from all leads
- Respondents were asked to select all that applied
- All respondents indicated their child is experiencing at least one GAD symptom
- Nearly 80% of respondents indicated their child has been experiencing worries about school, friends, or activities
- Almost 78% indicated their child has been experiencing lack of concentration
- Symptoms with the highest percentages reveal their prominence in children with

Survey Questions – GAD symptoms



How much has your child's symptoms of GAD impacted their daily life?




- Captured responses from all leads
- 98% of respondents indicated their child's GAD symptoms have somewhat to extremely impacted their daily life
- Reveals severity of disorder and may motivate parents to seek new treatment options

Survey Questions – GAD medication



Is your child currently taking medication to treat their GAD?




- Captured responses from all leads
- 72% of respondents indicated their child is not currently taking medication to treat GAD
- This could be due to lack of formal diagnosis

Survey Questions – GAD medication



On a scale from one to five, how satisfied are you with your child's current GAD medication?




- Captured responses from leads who indicated their child is taking GAD medications
- 64% indicated they are dissatisfied or extremely dissatisfied with their child's current treatment
- None of the respondents are extremely satisfied with their child's current treatment

Survey Questions – New treatment



On a scale from one to five, how interested are you in seeking new treatment to treat your child's GAD?




- Captured responses from all leads
- An overwhelming majority (92%) of respondents are interested or extremely interested in seeking new treatment options to treat GAD
- Indicates our audience is frustrated with their child's current or lack of treatment and are motivated to try something new

Survey Questions – Clinical trial



On a scale from one to five, how interested would you be in having your child participate in a clinical trial for GAD?



- Captured responses from all leads
- An overwhelming majority (90%) of respondents are interested or extremely interested in a clinical trial for their child
- Reveals that target audience is responsive, reachable, and highly motivated to allow their child to participate in GAD trial

Market test learnings – GAD patient profile





Profile

- Female, Age 7 to 14
- Diagnosed with GAD by a psychiatrist
- Experiencing GAD symptoms for over 2 years
- Not currently taking medication to treat GAD

Other Common Symptoms:

- Constant worrying
- Refusing to go to school
- Muscle aches or tension
- Sleep problems
- Clingy behavior with family members
- Feeling as though there is a lump in the throat
- Extreme tiredness or fatigue
- Being easily startled
- Being grouchy

She is frequently overcome with irrational fears and worries, especially about her friends, school, or activities. These thoughts are often accompanied by physical complaints like stomach aches or headaches. She also has difficulty concentrating and relaxing.

Her symptoms greatly impact her everyday life; hence her parents have expressed extreme interest in new treatment options and clinical trials for GAD in their area.

Market test summary



Key findings

- 54% of leads indicated their child is female and while 46% said their child is male
- 78% indicated their child is between 7-17 years of age
- Majority (78%) indicated their child has been experiencing symptoms of GAD for over a year
- All respondents indicated their child is experiencing at least one GAD symptom
- Nearly 80% of respondents indicated their child has been experiencing worries about school, friends, or activities
- Almost 78% indicated their child has been experiencing lack of concentration
- 72% of respondents indicated their child is not currently taking medication to treat GAD
- · Of those whose child is taking medication, 64% indicated they are dissatisfied with their child's current treatment
- · An overwhelming majority (90%) of respondents are interested in a clinical trial for their child

Market test learnings – Summary of conclusions



Objective

• Better understand young patients suffering symptoms of GAD

Conclusions

Survey confirmed children experiencing worries about school, friends, or activities, as well as lack of concentration and frequent stomach or headaches.

- It revealed that while 68% reported QofL being "extremely" impacted, a significant 72% were not taking medication.
- Nearly a third of patients were diagnosed by primary care or pediatricians other than a psychiatrist.

Recommendations

- Expand campaign reach beyond patients currently under psychiatrist care
- Add messaging about impact on school and social life
- Consider not only new RX options, but also new treatments in development
